Requesting Information

In accordance with 5 ILCS, Par. 140/1, Freedom of Information Act, the Park District of Oak Park shall make available to any person for inspection or copying all public records, except as otherwise provided in Section 7 of this Act.

All requests to inspect, copy, or certify public records must be submitted to the District in writing. The District encourages requestors to submit their requests on the convenient Park District of Oak Park Freedom of Information Request Form provided by the District which can be found online at www.pdop.org or at the District's Administration Center.

The District will review all written requests and will respond to each written request to inspect, copy, or certify public records in a manner consistent with the Illinois Freedom of Information Act after payment of any fees, if applicable

Summary of Purpose

The Park District of Oak Park, created in 1912, serves the recreational needs of the 52,000 residents of Oak Park, providing over 3,000 recreation programs and special events annually. Overseen by a Board of five elected officials, the District owns an Administrative Center, two outdoor pools, an indoor ice rink, the Oak Park Conservatory, Cheney Mansion, Pleasant Home, a gymnastics & recreation center, seven recreation centers plus 13 parks totaling 83 acres of parkland. Our mission is: "In partnership with the community, we enrich lives by providing meaningful experiences through programs, parks, and facilities."

Budget

The 2022 Operating Budget is \$17,084,820. The Park District also budgeted \$12,263,500 in 2022, for Capital Expenses. In 2021, the Park District received the Government Finance Officers Association's Distinguished Budget Presentation Award for the 14th year in a row, reflecting our organization's commitment to meet the highest principles of governmental budgeting. Taxes

The tax rate for the Park District increased with the 2005 voter approved referendum. Tax rates by their nature are dependent upon the amount of money asked for annually and the community's assessed value of property. In the 2020 tax year, the community's equalized assessed value increased 19.9%. The resulting tax rate for the District was 0.531. This represented an increase 0.015 from the previous year.

Park District Revenues are generated evenly from property taxes and fees for services, which are used to support maintenance and capital improvements of parks and facilities.


